Interview of Gery Mestre, Historic Cars **Commission Chairman**


Let's take a look at the genesis of Grand Prix de Monaco Historiaue

"In 1997, as a celebration for the 700th anniversary of the Grimaldi dynasty, Michel Boéri, President of Automobile Club of Monaco, launched the idea of a Grand Prix Historique. Many contestants enrolled in this premiere (circa 210 pilots). At first, this was supposed to be a "one shot" event. However, given its popularity and success, the ACM decided in 2000 to organise Grand Prix de Monaco Historique once every two years, two weeks before Formula One Grand Prix. Therefore, this year will be the ninth edition."

What about this year's line up?

"We made a modification on the authorized cars' years for races C & G, which enables more competitors to enlist.

We have teams coming from Britain, Germany, Italy, Japan, France and many other countries totalling 19 different nationalities."
