The eighteenth edition of Rallye Monte-Carlo Historique has begun. After Glasgow and Copenhagen this morning, the majority of contestants will start from Torino, Barcelona and Reims tomorrow evening.

Tomorrow's cities of departure, Friday 30th January 2015



From 6.30 p.m., 117 cars will start from **Torino** in direction of Sestriere, the French border, the Hautes-Alpes and Embrun. After a loop in the department of Vaucluse (Courthezon - Vaison-la-Romaine), the teams who started in **Piedmont** will be joined by all the other competitors in Saint-André-les-Alpes.



Capital of the Piedmont region, Torino ruled successively on the Duchy of Savoy, the Kingdom of Sardinia and was the first capital of unified Italy between the XIVth and XIXth centuries. Hometown of Fiat since 1899, Torino is still oriented to automobile but also to aeronautic and spatial sectors.



At 7p.m. 49 teams will be departing from Barcelona, Gaudi's beloved city. They will drive in direction of the Pyrenees and will cross the French border toward Vallespir and Amélie-les-Bains before heading to the Cevennes (Saint-Hyppolite-du-Fort) and Saint-André-les-Alpes.



Second city of Spain and capital of Generalitat de Catalunya, Barcelona counts around five millions inhabitants. Its harbour is one of the greatest of the Mediterranean Sea and Catalonia is one of the most touristic regions of southern Europe thanks to its climate and exceptional cultural heritage.





At the same moment, the last teams will be starting from Reims, "Kings' city". They will be 115 behind the skilled Jean Ragnotti, crossing the Marne in direction of Le-Puy-en-Velay with the teams of Stockholm and Copenhagen.



Also called "La ville des sacres" (city of the royal crowning), Reims is located in the Champagne-Ardenne region. This region is the homeland of an internationally known beverage, champagne, which is one of its economic assets. Located on the edge of the Parisian Basin, the city isn't far from the borders with Germany, Luxembourg and Belgium.



The French channel France 3 Champagne-Ardenne will broadcast two moments this Friday: At 12 a.m. (in the JT du 12/13) from the check-ups At 7 p.m. (in the JT du 19/20) from the starting podium.
