This Saturday, Saint-André-les-Alpes welcomed all the participants of the 18th edition of Rallye Monte-Carlo **Historique**. Departing from different cities spread in southern and northern Europe, the regrouped in the late morning and early afternoon in the little village of the Alpes de Haute-Provence to prepare for the first Regularity Zone the schedule: Saint-Jean-la-Rivière / Levens (11.97 km). With approximately 900 inhabitants, Saint-André-les-Alpes has always been very welcoming for the motorsports followers.



Located on the Nice/Grenoble axis, close to the artificial lake of Castillon, the village is the entrance of the High Verdon-Valley. It is also close to Castellane (south) and not far from Barrême and Digne-les-Bains (north)

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A dozen of teams had to retire since the beginning, among them are Jean-Michel Raoux / Yannick Dieu and their rare Facel-Vega Facellia from 1960 (connecting rod) and a regular of the monegasque event, André Recordier, betrayed by the clutch of his Fiat X1.9
