Leaving this morning from Valence, all the teams of the XVIIIth edition of Rallye Monte-Carlo Historique will be back in the Principality of Monaco in the afternoon. They will stop and rest for a little while as the first competitors will leave again at 9p.m. for the Final Leg. The teams on the podium remain the same as yesterday even if the order has changed.

Three regularity zones were on schedule of the second part of the Common Leg between Valence and Monaco.

In the third position yesterday, Durand and Chol have been leading the race since the second regularity zone. In the last ZR, the Italian team Zanchi/Agnese caught up with the Belgians Maes/ **Deplancke**, now at the 3rd position.

Even if the final podium seems to be destined to these three teams, they will have to watch out for the German team Jüngtgen/Müller and their little DKW F12 (winners in 2008, 3rd in 2005 and 2011) who are just behind in the 4th position.

The Automobile Club de Monaco commissaires' professionalism is greatly valued both in circuits and rally. Their long-established expertise is updated every year thanks to very specific training.

Last December, under the direction of Bernard Richelmi, President of the Marshals Commission of the ACM, the marshals were tested on their abilities to react to an eventual incident on the road.

Just after the first round of the FIA WRC they were able to put into practice their skills for the XVIIIth edition of Rallye Monte-Carlo Historique.
